#### The Art of Being Still

#### Isaiah 30:15b; Psalm 46:10a

Life has lots of noise, pressure, fear, and anger. Our struggle is finding time to be still when life seems to be in panic mode.

Psalm 46 is an outstanding example of that fact; it expresses the emotions of a person enduring great difficulties. It begins with "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in time of trouble." It ends with "The Lord of Hosts is with us."

Have you ever had any moment like that in your life? You are scared to death about the next step. You know a decision has to be made. You know you are standing on one of those life moments and you know that after this moment life will never be the same. Fear consumes you. Your heart is beating so hard and your hair feels like it is keeping time.

Maybe you are running today. You are running from some trouble in your life. Maybe you are running from a specific person. Maybe you are simply running from doing what you know you should be doing. Your heart and soul are screaming at you but you are trying to run to keep it quiet. You surround yourself with all the noise in life, the running we all do in life to deafen that voice that calls out to us within ourselves.

To remain still in the face of advancing danger takes more courage than is natural among men and women. It means ceasing to rely upon self, and trusting implicitly in the promises of God. Hezekiah, the king of Judah, was in great trouble at one time and a huge army of heathens was about to destroy Jerusalem, and there was nothing the monarch could do to prevent the disaster. The fact that he was partly to blame for the situation did not decrease



his fear. He had taken the gold and silver from the temple hoping it would purchase peace. Unfortunately, the sight of such treasure increased the avarice of the enemy, and Hezekiah quickly discovered "he had gone out of the frying pan into the fire.

"Take a moment in your life today to be still in front of God. Take a moment to stop running and stop thinking you can do it all on your own.

God is in the thin space where the distance between heaven and earth feels thinner.

God seems closer.

You feel more at peace and confident. God is found in the quiet.

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on 2nd July.

#### **Public Participation:**

PCSO Jon Hurst reported that the distribution of **Operation Shield Kits** had started but that officers were finding very few householders at home when they called to deliver. 'Drop in' sessions were being held on the forecourt of the Barbour Institute which were proving successful. The first one had 52 people collect their kits. Further sessions would be held, again on the forecourt. Look out for dates to be announced on Tattenhall Online.

Concerns were also raised on the lack of response from the police reporting number '101'. PC Ged Gigg attributed some of it to the rise in reported issues. He added that serious matters such as burglary and assault should be reported on '999'.

The Parish Council agreed to write to the Chief Constable and the Police & Crime Commissioner with the villages' concerns.

# Anti Social Behaviour on Keysbrook

It appeared that only one resident was reporting this issue when it arose. It was felt more resources could be allocated if more residents telephoned to report incidents. PC Gigg had spoken with the youngsters involved and had also taken up the issue with the owners of the site, Sanctuary Housing.

#### **Neighbourhood Plan:**

Under recent boundary changes, the

neighbourhood plan designated boundaries and the new boundaries enacted by CWaC were in conflict. To rectify this a Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group was proposed to look at this issue and also a partial review of the Plan itself. Councillor Carol Weaver would head the Steering Group and anyone wishing to assist was asked to contact her or the Parish Clerk whose contact details can be found on this page.

#### **Tree Maintenance:**

A site meeting had taken place between Councillors and an employee of Amenity Tree Care. Amenity had written a report on several trees in The Spinney and also alongside the Mill Brook. The proposals in the report were accepted and work would be undertaken in the near future.

#### Village Emergency Plan:

A comprehensive document adopted several years ago, now needed to be updated. Councillor Georgina Blackhurst would lead the team from the Community Safety Group. Again, if any resident would like to be involved in this work, contact her or the Parish Clerk whose details are at the top of the page. Residents can raise items for the Parish Council during Public Participation, notionally the first 15 minutes of the monthly meeting. The next meeting takes place on 7<sup>th</sup> August upstairs at the Barbour Institute in the Billiard Room, commencing at 7.30pm.

Between 08:00 and 13:54 hours on 11<sup>th</sup> July, a high value dark grey adult's pedal cycle was taken from a farm on Newton Lane.
