FROM THE RECTOR

Let us learn more about our Church and its structures

In the coming months, I will be writing about the church and how it is run. I will also be explaining the functions of the various committees that are responsible for running certain areas of our local church. Although I will be referring to Tattenhall Church in most of the writings, this applies generally to our sister churches namely; St John's Burwardsley and All Saints Handley. The reason behind these educational materials is to allow you as our dear parishioner to have knowledge and understanding about your church and how it is run. This knowledge will enable you to understand and contribute to the life of your church in areas where you feel comfortable. I have taken this liberty of writing because there is in many cases an assumption that our parishioners know these things and yet our survey shows the opposite. There is also a passage of scripture where Philip, a disciple of Christ questions the Ethiopian Official who was reading a passage of scripture but having no clue of what it meant. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked the Ethiopian. And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him and explained the scripture. (Acts 8:31-31) In this month's edition, I will summarise the structure of the Church of England, its leadership and governance. The Church of England is led by the Archbishop of Canterbury and York and 106 bishops. These are also known as the primates and together with the Diocesan Bishops, provide guidance and direction to the churches across the country. There is also the General Synod which an assembly of bishops, clergy and laity who create the laws of the church. These institutions work

The Archbishop of Canterbury is responsible for churches in the southern two-thirds of England. He also fills a unique position in the world-wide Anglican Church as spiritual leader.

The Archbishop of York is the senior bishop responsible for churches in the northern third of England. Together they lead the vision and direction of the Church of England. Each of our 42 dioceses has a lead



bishop known as a diocesan bishop. Most are supported by other (suffragan or area) bishops. All diocesan bishops are members of the House of Bishops, along with a small number other elected bishops. The House of Bishops is one of the three houses of the General Synod. The General Synod is an assembly of bishops, clergy and laity, which meets at least twice a year to debate and decide the Church's laws and discuss matters of public interest. Our two archbishops and 24 other bishops sit in the House of Lords, making a major contribution to Parliament's work. They are known as Lords Spiritual. Her Majesty the Queen is the Supreme Governor of the Church of England. The Queen appoints archbishops, bishops and deans of cathedrals on the advice of the Prime Minister. There are seven national administrative bodies that works together to support the mission and ministries of the Church. These are called National Church Institutions (NCIs). Each has a role to play in helping the day -to-day work of churches across England. They serve as the Church's central office, managing finance, education, communications, and more, to keep the

He says: "Many of the deacons ordained this weekend, have been praying, thinking, discerning and preparing for this moment for a very long time. It was a privilege to be able to join with them and share this special occasion. Ordination is an important milestone in Christian ministry and a sacred event marked before God, with friends and family."

Bishop Peter Appoints Officer for Self Supporting Ministry

The Bishop of Chester has appointed the Revd Lyndon Bannon as Bishops' Officer for Self Supporting Ordained Ministry. The Revd Lyndon will be responsible for supporting members of the clergy who are licensed by the bishop but are not in full time ministry. These are clergy who assist our parish priests in our diocese and their role is extremely valued.

Autumn Bible Study

Many thanks for all those who managed to come to our June and July Summer Bible study series on 'Forgiveness and Reconciliation'. Our next bible study is going to be on Wednesday 17th October in the Vault. We will be looking at "Searching Stories' from the Gospel of Luke which takes us to the heart of the Gospel.

17th October: Introductory Session

This session will consider the significance of stories in the life and faith and in the Gospel of Luke; and will explore how our human stories are interpreted and challenged in the light of Christ's story.

24th October: Session One- "Road to Emmaus"

In this session, we will enter into the Emmaus story (Luke 24:13-35) and will consider how the Risen Christ encounters us on our Journeys and in our stories, in the guise of a stranger and in the ordinariness of life.

31st October: Session Two- "The Good Samaritan"

We will enter into Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) and his encounter with the lawyer; and will allow the story to challenge and test the boundaries of our understanding of God's grace.

7th November: Session Three- "The Prodigal Son"

We will enter into Jesus' parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32) and will explore the ways in which God's love is offered and responded to in different relationships within the parable, and within our own lives.

14th November: Session Four- "The Widow and the Judge"

In this session, we will explore Jesus' parable of the Widow and the Judge (Luke 18:1-8); and will consider the ways in which persistence is a necessary element of faith.

21st November: Session Five – "Zacchaeus"

This session explores the story of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10) and the ways in which we are met in the present by the living Christ.



There have been numerous scam telephone calls to residents informing them that their Internet connection will be shut down within forty eight hours. Please ignore this scam, or call BT to arrange to block these and other similar nuisance numbers.

Nuisance dogs and their owners are again in the news. In the Milton Green area there have been reports of dogs worrying livestock. Owners are reminded to keep their pets under control near livestock as the stock owner has the right to shoot their pet. There have also been reports of dog faeces on the play area on Tattenhall Park. Some dog owners have been seen bringing their pet onto the play area while attending with their children. No dogs are allowed within that particular child's play area.
