A Letter from the Rural Dean of Malpas The Revd Canon Ian Davenport

Dear All,

Summer is upon us which is for many a time of rest and recreation- a time for a change of pace- of hopefully being able to enjoy warmer days- of possibly catching up with family and friends. For some there will be exciting times like a wedding in the family for others sadness and sorrow and of a looking back to happier times.

Jesus took time in his busy life to be still and to reflect and to pray about his Father's will for his future and that is something that we can all do and benefit from. 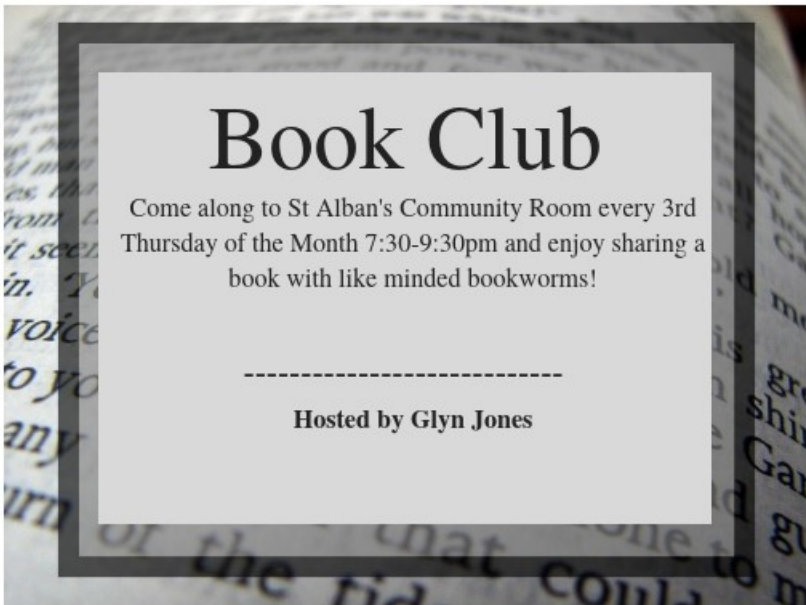

Before the Parish Council meeting on 1st July, there was a presentation by Kathryn Jones, an officer of CWaC, on the "Right to Bid and Assets of Community Value" scheme. This was introduced as part of the Localism Legislation and allows communities to register assets of Community Value. It does not, however, guarantee the right to buy, just to bid.

There has been some discussion about what assets Tattenhall has that it might be good to protect.

In the first instance, it has been suggested that the two public houses, the Spar shop and the Post Office should be registered.

At the Parish Council meeting, which began at 7.30pm, a number of residents had points to raise.

The Treasurer of 1st Sandstone Scouts and the Captain of the St. Alban's Bell Tower thanked the Parish Council for the donations they had received towards their projects. One had enabled the scouts to rebuild the porch of the scout hut and the other was welcomed as part of a large amount needed to repair the church bells.

A resident confirmed that the Bear and Ragged Staff had been bought by a consortium of residents who planned to open it as a public house in 2020.

Issues such as overgrown trees and footpaths were raised. The Parish Council would contact CWaC about these.

Traffic issues such as parking, the speed sign outside the school and the 20mph signs were matters of concern.

Items on the main Agenda included:

Planning. A number of new applications had been received and were considered at the meeting;

Community Land Trust. A report was given on the current position ;

Chester Road Parking and Speed Restrictions. CWaC hoped that these matters would be resolved by the end of July;

Best Kept Village and Squirrel Trail.

The judges had not yet given a date for their visit so litter picking and keeping the village tidy continued as a priority. The Squirrel Trail had raised almost £1000 for the Air Ambulance to date. Leaflets were still available and the squirrels would remain in place over the summer;

Open Space. The Clerk confirmed that she had written to the school about access to the playing field during the summer holiday. A letter had been received from the Chair of Governors to the effect that the field would not be made available due to health and safety concerns;

Community Room. The working group reported that no-one had come forward to be a Trustee of the room. It was hoped the school could arrange a holiday club for the summer and the situation would be reviewed in September. Cllr. White was nominated as the Parish Council's representative on the Board;

War Memorial. Work would be undertaken to redress a long standing error in the name of one of the fallen.

Please note: There is NO Parish Council meeting in August.

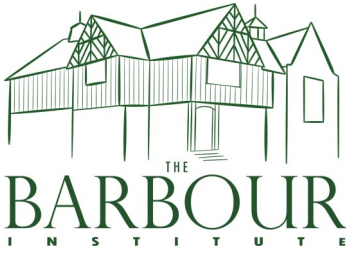
Tattenhall War Memorial

YOUR CHURCH - WHO CARES?

If you were in a crowded room and everyone who is convinced the Church of England is rich was asked to put their hand up - would yours go up? Mine would too I think, not because I am convinced but because I have assumed. I don't know why and do not know enough about it to have a debate but what I can categorically state is St Alban's is NOT rich and urgently needs an injection of funds. This may be news to you; it certainly was an eye opener for me.

Our Income does not cover the amount we have to spend to keep the church running. It costs roughly £3000 per month to do that and this figure does not include maintenance, repairs and renewals. With that added in (vital to maintain the fabric of the church) plus the parish share (a significant amount of money every parish pays to the Diocese) our average monthly expenditure last year was £6000 resulting in a £10,353 overspend. This can not continue.

Last month I asked for help with jobs. This month I am asking for help with finances. I give below some conventional ways of helping but read on as you might find an idea or two you had not thought of.

- *Pay a set amount each month directly into the church bank account*
- *Collection Plate*
- *Designated envelope scheme*
- *Join Friends of St Alban's*

COME TO THE FUND RAISERS!

An increased attendance would make a difference to our funds. The events are good fun and always enjoyed by those who attend. Make a difference – make an effort!

AND HERE IS AN IDEA WAY OFF THE RADAR

Take a peek inside the church and sit for a while. You will then see and feel that this place is worth preserving for the generations to come. The church is open every day from 10.00 am – 5.00 pm.

This brings to mind a precious memory. My husband's uncle who farmed in deepest Devon often used to lean on a gate and stare out at his land touched only by ploughs and animals. One day I asked him why and he said
