We Remember Them in All That We Do

It is that time of the year when as a nation, we are called to 'Remember our fallen heroes in both past and present wars.

To remember is not only about bringing loved ones to mind, but calls us to do things, to honour their memory and the impact they have had upon us. In our remembrance, we have to lift up all those things the deceased have taught us so that their lives continue through our own hearts. To remember is to embrace both the strengths and imperfections of those whom we have lost by continuing to foster our strengths and improve upon our own shortcomings. We have to do what is necessary—to keep in mind that what we do will have an impact on others' lives. The words remind us how important the idea of remembrance is to our sacred tradition. Each day we live and each holiday we celebrate are a constant reminder of those who fought and died so that we might have peace. Memory is not only integral to our tradition, but is part of all humanity. We are told not to forget those catastrophes that have struck all peoples. We are challenged to remember facts and formulas that help us become well-rounded. We are asked to reflect upon ourselves and plan to improve what we can about ourselves. To remember is what we do every day and in every way.

In the rising of the sun, and in its going down, we remember them.

From the moment I wake till I fall asleep, all that I do is remember them.

Observe Remembrance Day

People stop work to observe a moment of silence at 11am on November 11, which is the time and date when hostilities formally ended after more than four years of battle during World War I. Poppies are worn as a symbol of respect and tribute on Remembrance Sunday and/or November 11. The day is also marked by events such as memorial services, church services and parades.

In Tattenhall, the church will hold a service on the 10th November at 10am in church and is followed by the laying of wreaths at the Cenotaph at 11am. All are welcome either by joining us in church or at the Cenotaph.

Appreciation

I must first give thanks to God for the gift of faith and his loving invitation to share in his divine life. And not only did he see fit to bless me with this faith, but he also called me to the sacred priesthood and to be your rector here in Tattenhall. For such a gift, I can only bow in humble gratitude. Donations were invited for The Atlantic Salmon Trust.





A meeting will be held on 18th November at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute for members of the public and interested groups who would like to be involved in the VE Day Celebrations. Please come along and share your ideas so that Tattenhall can be well represented on 8th May 2020.

PCSO Jon Hurst came to the Parish Council Meeting on 7th October with an update on recent events in the parish. He mentioned that a Night of Action would be held locally when officers would look out for illegal activities and suspicious vehicles. He also told the meeting that PC Ged Gigg had been replaced by PC Steve Gardner, who would be the Rural Beat Manager. His details can be found on the Homewatch page.

A resident reported that there was a major issue with flooding on roads to the south and west of the village and there had been a number of occasions over the summer when the roads had been flooded and Rocky Lane had been impassable.

He asked the Parish Council to put pressure on CW&C to resolve these issues and broker a meeting with the Bolesworth Estate and Highways to discuss these on- going problems. He suggested the Parish Council write to Handley and District Parish Council and ask what actions were being taken to resolve the flooding at the end of Frog Lane. The lack of dropped kerb access for wheelchair and buggy users was raised.

Also raised were the gritting routes through Tattenhall. Again, residents should tell CWaC of their concerns before winter sets in.

How to protect the green space on Oaklands was also brought up.

Items on the Agenda included:

School Transport

It was reported that CWaC are looking at their policy on school transport and split villages, and in the meantime the problems for this year had been alleviated.

Allotments

There were two vacant allotments at Gatesheath, both of which were overgrown. Some work had been done to tidy them up but more was needed. The allotments are quite large and the Parish Council would be prepared to reduce them in size to anyone interested in renting. A meeting with existing plot holders would be arranged.

Open Space Provision

A letter had been received from the Governing Body of Tattenhall Primary School advising that the school playing field could not be opened to the public in school holidays. The working group would meet with the GB to ask them to expand on their reasoning and to point out the provisions in the Local Plan Part

The working group had met with the Directors of Tattenhall Recreation Club about the lack of open space and had met with a good response. Some suggestions had been made which would be explored in more detail.

The Spinney

A working group was looking at the possibility of making the Spinney more accessible to the public.

Play Area

The zip wire structure had now been repaired and when the buffer mechanism had been replaced it would be back in use.

Gift

An album had been given to the Parish Council with photos of all the squirrels which were in the village over the summer. It would be placed in the Library so that the public could view it.



I can only say how grateful I am to ALL those who contributed but especially those who assisted by waking with me.









