#### ST ALBAN'S LOCKDOWN UPDATE

Whilst the Parish News Magazine was suspended we have been keeping the community up to date with church news through a temporary newsletter. We weren't able to deliver these so they appeared online and gave updates on church activities. Here are some updated highlights of the last few months.



#### The Churchyard

Starting last summer we have taken over maintenance ourselves rather than use the Probation Service. The first task was to purchase a mower and then form a team of people to take responsibility for a section of the churchyard.

We now have a team of nine to do the maintenance. There has even been competition for the mower (!) so a second machine has now been acquired along with a couple of strimmers to cut round the gravestones. We have also been able to mow round the wild flowers particularly primroses and wild garlic which gave a good display.

With parts of St Alban's dating back to the 1500's it was a relief in August to be told there were no major repairs required but continuing maintenance, attention to the roof and bell tower, updating some electrics and keeping the churchyard tidy are always part of the continuing costs of keeping St Alban's open.



# **Father Lameck**

# 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." (Rom 12:31)

The Christian response to plagues begins with some of Jesus' most famous teachings: "Do unto others as you would have

them do unto you"; "Love your neighbour as yourself"; "Greater love has no man than this, that he should lay down his life for his friends." Put plainly, the Christian ethic in a time of pandemic considers that our own life must always be regarded as less important than that of our neighbour.

As a Church, we are very grateful to you all for the love and support that we have received. The church and community worked together providing weekly devotions, Sunday sermons and pastoral care. Volunteers ensured that everyone was cared for by checking if their neighbours were in need of help, buying groceries, collecting food for the less fortunate, creating a food bank and walking other people's dogs.

So where do we go from here?' It's a question that many people are asking. What does our 'new normal' look like? Will our church survive? It is difficult to answer most of these questions. We are less able to plan for the future when we do not know what life will be like next month! So, let us not be too hard on ourselves. Be released from pressure to have everything sorted, driven by guilt, envy or a need to keep up with others.

As we move into autumn, allow yourself to be receptive to God. The months ahead will also bring new opportunities to have deeper transforming conversations leading to positive action in some of the major issues facing us in the 2021. But one thing I know is that together, we can meet the future challenges with confidence as St Paul says in Romans 8: 37-39 "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, [k] neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord".





The Parish Council held its monthly meeting by Zoom on 7th September.

During Public Participation, Jonathan Fell spoke about the plans for a Drive Through experience at the Ice Cream Farm, which are awaiting a decision. Lesley Grainger, Chairman of the Community Land Trust, reported that the planning application, submitted in January, had been delayed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Discussion with the case officer at CWaC had led to the application being called in to Planning Committee as it was likely it would be recommended for refusal in its present form.

Nick Benefield reported that a number of people had contacted him about the Transition Village proposition, who would be interested in getting involved.

# From the Agenda:

The Parish Council had received a number of planning applications to which it had raised no objection. The comments made on behalf of the Ice Cream farm were noted but no further action would be taken until the planning application was received.

The Parish Council had been considering establishing Assets of Community Value but had decided not to proceed with this project.

The working group on the Neighbourhood Plan Review was due to meet on Zoom. Catherine Morgatroyd from CWaC would join the meeting to talk about the Government's White Paper on Planning.

Work had been done on the Parish Council's website to improve its accessibility.

The Parish Council's Risk Assessment policies would be reviewed later this year.

A Risk Assessment with regard to meetings in public had been undertaken. It was agreed that all meetings would be held on Zoom for the foreseeable future.

A grant to support the production of the Parish News was approved at the meeting.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on 5th October at 7.30pm. Residents are invited to join the meeting and should contact the Parish Clerk for a Zoom link.


