Remembrance Sunday

St Alban's Tattenhall- 12th November at 10.00am

Remembrance Day commemorates men and women who died in the First and Second World Wars and the Korean War. The first Remembrance Day was conducted in 1919 throughout the Commonwealth. Originally called Armistice Day, it commemorated the end of the First World War, "the War to end all Wars", on Monday, November 11, 1918 at 11:00 AM (the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month).

From 1923 to 1931, Armistice Day was held on the Monday of the week in which November 11 fell. Thanksgiving was also celebrated on this day. In 1931, M.P. Allan Neill introduced a bill to hold Armistice Day on a fixed day - November 11. During the bill's introduction, it was decided the word "Remembrance" would be used instead of "Armistice". The bill passed and Remembrance Day was conducted on November 11, 1931. Thanksgiving Day was moved to October 12 that year.

What does Remembrance Day mean us today?

It is a time to think of the sacrifices made by those who fought in the two great world

Wars and those who continue to die in the more recent wars. Remembrance Day is a day we thank our young men and women for the great sacrifice they did for our country, to make the United Kingdom what it is today. We all need to say thank you to them. We will never forget them and we will never forget what they did for us. That's what Remembrance Day means to most of us, just a way to say thank you to our great men and women for their great sacrifice to us. Regardless of time period, these individuals have been fighting for the same purpose. Some sacrificed their lives, and some returned home changed by what they saw in the line of duty. This is why we have to say, "We will remember them".

Please note that the Remembrance service will be held at **10am in church** and the 2 minutes silence **at 11am will now be held at the War Memorial**. All members of our community are welcome to both services. After the service at the War Memorial, all are invited to the Barbour Institute for some

They had a very strong bond and would often be seen supporting the grandchildren in their chosen hobbies. She was a very kind and loving person and would do anything to help people who needed it. Jan was a wonderful Wife, Mum, Grandma, Sister and Aunt and friend to so many. She will be deeply missed by all.

Keith Whaley (1942 – 2023)

Keith was born in Redcar on 2nd September 1942. He studied Medicine at Newcastle University and had a distinguished career in Clinical Immunology specialising in teaching and research in autoimmune disease. His work involved collaboration with others in the field and he enjoyed travelling to meetings worldwide. He worked in the United States and he completed his career in the Middle East enjoying with Myr 10 happy and fulfilling years which also allowed Keith to indulge in his favourite sport of sailing. After returning to Scotland Keith and Myr came to Tattenhall in 2013 where they have enjoyed village life and meeting new friends. Keith enjoyed a happy and fulfilling life. He was a loving and dedicated husband, Dad and Grandad. He is sorely missed.

With a strong work ethic, he qualified as a Chartered Surveyor and went on to become president of the Institute of Revenues and Rating, a highlight in a career that gave him so much pleasure with Dixon Henderson and Dixon Webb, Widnes and Liverpool offices.

Peter met his wife, a world class ice skater at the time, whilst on holiday in the Isle of Man and got married on October 10th 1959. They went on to enjoy a very happy and full family life with children Janet and Paul, some 6 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren. He committed himself not only to family, but his large friendship group who meant so much to him, many formed through his walking and love of cricket, not to mention his extensive charitable work with Rotary, Probus and Abbeyfield. In their later years they moved to Gifford Lea retirement village where they enjoyed the final chapter of their lives, a short drive from the family home in Frodsham. He will be sadly missed.

TATTENHALL PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL GARDEN PROJECT

Since the School Garden Project started in February 2023, it has progressed very successfully, particularly with local support from businesses, The Parish Council and local individuals.

Transition Tattenhall Members have given up their time and offered gardening knowledge, which has been invaluable.

The School Staff have played a major part in developing the Project along with several volunteers .

A Gardening Club was formed after Easter with 10-12 pupils taking part in caring for the Memorial Garden and other planted areas in the School playground.

This Autumn term plans are already afoot for over wintering and Spring planting.

Vegetable produce has been displayed and sold at the School Fair, with the Spar shop selling our green beans raising well over £35, this money will be ploughed back into the Garden Project.

Exhibits were entered at The Village Show earlier this month, and 2 second place certificates were awarded for the sweet peas and cosmos annuals.

The vegetables displayed were less successful but the taking part is what matters.

At an extraordinary meeting in August, the changes to the neighbourhood plan and village design code, which had been reviewed assiduously by the working group were endorsed by councillors meaning it will now be submitted for formal consultation and then examination by CWAC council.

This month's meeting came after the sad passing of PCSO John Hurst after a cancer diagnosis; a bench next to the fetch statue at the Flacca bearing his name is under consideration.

It was decided that the new pond opposite the Spinney will be permanently wetted with puddling clay providing a year-round habitat for birds, amphibians and water-loving plants. Councillors also agreed to proceed with the clearing of the ha-ha between Glebe Meadow and the Rookery, £1000 of the cost has been pledged by Mike Jones from his CWAC member's budget.

The base of the war memorial was successfully re-pointed with lime mortar at the end of August by Bell Stone Masonry of Saughall, twenty-one slabs in total were re-

laid meaning that the fallen of our village can once again be properly commemorated.

Four nominations were received for this year's village cup which will be awarded to the winner at our annual parish meeting on the 20th September at the Barbour Institute (7:30pm start).



CHRISTMAS 2023

Festivities will commence at Barbour Square on the evening of **Friday 1st December** with the lights being switched on and Alison's open for shopping and refreshments. The night will culminate with a tractor run in aid of charity from Tattenhall to Tarporley, all whilst being serenaded by carol singing and a Vintage organ. The children's Christmas parties led by Diddy Dance and Panache will once again be taking place the following day at the Barbour Institute.

Have you heard about the Repair Café? A Repair Café is where people take broken household equipment which would otherwise be thrown out, and Transition Tattenhall runs one here. It is held monthly, on the **last Sunday of the month, in the Barbour institute, from 10am-12 noon.**

Refreshments are available, hence the 'café' name.

We try to fix each item, returning it to working order, saving it from landfill and associated carbon emissions, and saving you having to buy new. We try not to work on equipment that you would otherwise pay someone to fix, but we like fixing things that are too low in value for a paid repair. We will have a look at most household items (except large white goods), and we also sharpen tools and knives. A full list of what we can look at is on the Transition Tattenhall web site [What can the Repair Cafe repair - Transition Tattenhall](#).

Our repairs are free, but we welcome a donation. We started with crowd-funding and grants from CW&C and Tattenhall Parish Council, but we do have ongoing costs and donations help with these.

The Repair Cafe has run every month (bar Christmas) since starting in July 2022. To date we have fixed 151 items, saving we estimate 3.6 tonnes of CO₂, and about £7550 for people of Tattenhall not needing to replace (basis £50/item).

We have a great team of repairers, but if you would like to join them, please do get in touch, using the details below.

Next time you are about to throw something out, think again and bring it to us at the Tattenhall Repair Café.—we may well be able to help. Or just call in to have a look at how it works.
