

Father Lameck's Christmas Message "Christmas Presence" The True Light

The True Light of Christmas (John 8:12 -21)

In John 1:1-5, we read that Jesus came into the world as the Light of the World. It is little wonder that a bright star revealed to the searching Magi where He could be found. After all, He was, and still is the Light. It is wonderful that we have so many lights burning brightly during the Christmas season in all our towns and villages. They are reminders in a bleak, dark world that there is a True Light that shines upon all mankind. Jesus came to be the Light, but the darkness does not accept Him. Only when we open our hearts to Him, can the light of truth, joy and peace come into our lives.

A little girl forgot her lines in a Sunday school presentation but her mother was in the front row to prompt her. She gestured and formed the words silently with her lips, but it did not help. Her daughter's memory was still blank. In the end, the mother leaned forward and whispered; "I am the light of the world." The child beamed and with great feeling and a loud, clear voice said, "My mother is the light of the world. "This young girl was sincere, but sincerely wrong. And so are a lot of people today who are looking for Light in all the wrong places. But thanks be to God, Jesus came to be the light that can be seen by the eyes of faith. That is what Christmas is all about. Jesus came because we are in the dark.

The Gospel story has light in it. "The glory of the Lord shone around them,"

and we can only picture glory through light. This is the true meaning of Christmas--"Do not be afraid, for see I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people, to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour who is the

Messiah, the Lord." Christmas arrives again with all the promise of remembrance and celebration.

Christians celebrate Christmas because the light did dawn. The birth of Jesus in Bethlehem was not only the fulfilment of Biblical





Marjorie Chalk (90 years old)

Marjorie Chalk was born in Connah's Quay in 1933. Marjorie enjoyed her time at school, working hard and going on to attend Grammar School. During this time, she also spent many happy hours in her Grandmother's bakery learning the craft of baking. Following her time at Grammar school she secured a place at Leicester College to build on her already

competent domestic science skills. She had a desire to teach, and it was during her teacher training in Southampton that she met her husband to be Tony. They married and moved to Tattenhall in 1963. Greenlands was to be their family home for many years. In 1964 their daughter Susan was born, then two years later their son Martin.

Marjorie enjoyed a full and socially active village life. Teaching at Tattenhall Park primary school, she engaged in many extra-curricular activities. She was blessed with a granddaughter whom she adored, and this made her world complete. In retirement Marjorie and Tony set up Chalko Leisure organising trips for friends and family to shows in the West End and also walking parties to take in the stunning scenery of the Lake District. This was an extremely rewarding time in her life. Marjorie eventually moved to Gifford Lea retirement village in October 2022 where she spent the last few months of her life enjoying making new friends and socialising in the dining area. Marjorie's family would like to thank everyone for the kind expressions of sympathy shown towards them at this time.

Molly Powell 1934 - 2023

Molly was born in London in 1934. She was a proud Londoner who enjoyed telling stories of her beloved city. Her memories of the Second World War were vivid. She often recalled a night during the Blitz air raids, watching from her bedroom window, the dome of St Paul's Cathedral lit up as search lights crossed and recrossed the sky searching for attacking

planes. She learnt her times-tables sitting in the Underground during the air raids and loved waving to the pilots in their Spitfires as they flew over her house. Molly was one of the first children to have a new medicine called "antibiotics" when she was seriously ill with Bronchial Pneumonia, aged 10. The family doctor encouraged her to take the medicine whispering to her that it was a national secret that Winston Churchill had also been given these experimental drugs. The antibiotics kept her – and Winston Churchill alive. Molly and husband John moved to Watford in 1957, where they had their three daughters. Teaching was her passion and during the 1980's she rose to become Deputy Head teacher at a large secondary school in London. During her time teaching she completed a BA degree from home. They were different times then; her young male tutor told her it was impossible to finish a degree whilst working and having three children. It was just what she needed - to prove him wrong! Molly and John worshipped in the Diocése of St Albans in Hertfordshire for over fifty years and she treasured that link when she came each Sunday to St Alban's Church, Tattenhall. Molly moved to Tattenhall three years ago to be nearer her daughters and where she made many good friends, both at church and Gifford Lea. Molly was an independent spirit, passionate about equal opportunities in education and work. She was always clever, often wise with a great sense of humour. That strong spirit has definitely been passed down to her daughters and granddaughters and will continue as her legacy.

At the November meeting the new Chairman of Governors of the primary school, Peter Brown, introduced himself together with Nicky Bolton, the new head from January 2024. He confirmed that the school intends to work closely with the community and the Parish Council welcomed this.

A question was raised as to who had asked that a report be prepared on the Recycling Centre and why the subsequent changes on the site had been made. It was confirmed that the Health and Safety Executive had required the report and the subsequent changes after a review of all Cheshire and North Wales sites following a site accident in North Wales.

A survey had been conducted both online and through the Parish News about the possible installation of a Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) and outdoor gym equipment. 218 surveys were completed. The responses to the question "Would you support the creation of a MUGA in Tattenhall" were Yes 68%, Maybe 10%, No 22%. A working group was set up to consider the detail of the responses and to agree next steps.

The availability of sandbags provided by Chester West and Chester Council is under threat as they will no longer provide these in advance of potential flood risk but only when there is an incident. There is concern that this will lead to too long a delay to supply sandbags and the Parish Council agreed to investigate where sand/

sandbags could be safely stored within the village which villagers could access.

The Parish Council owns a number of allotments at Gatesheath. The fees for the next year were considered at the meeting with the annual fee for a large plot set at £56 with concessions for those over 60. All the plots are currently occupied but if you wish to be put on the waiting list please contact the Clerk at

clerk@tattenhallpc.co.uk.

The Parish Council is organising a Christmas event at Barbour Square on Friday 1st December between 6pm and 8pm. Decorated tractors will be on display prior to leaving at 7.30pm on a tractor run through Tattenhall. Tattenhall Singers and school children will perform and food and drink will be available with free hot chocolate for children.

The Rotary Club of Tarporley will again be helping Father Christmas to take his float around the village starting at 5pm on Thursday December 14th.

It was agreed that a funding application would be made to expand the number of defibrillators in the Parish.

All residents are very welcome to attend Parish Council meetings and can raise any issue in the 15-minute Public Participation section at the start of the meeting. The next meeting is on 15th January at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute.


