Why Does Lent Matter?



Lent is a significant season in the year for Christians, lasting for just over six weeks leading up to Easter. It is a time of solemnity and self-reflection. A time when we consider our short falls and resolve to live a godlier life based on the teachings of Jesus. The challenge is to make three changes in our daily Christian lives. The three traditional pillars of Lent are fasting, prayer and alms giving. In our modern life this is interpreted as give something up, take something up, do something charitable.

Traditionally it is a time of fasting from rich foods. Nowadays we might give up a luxury food, such as chocolate. We may also give up an activity such as using social media. It is called Lent because it is the time of the

year when days are lengthening and lasts forty days to reflect the amount of time Jesus spent in the wilderness overcoming temptations. As Lent is tied to Easter, the start date varies and this year, it is particularly early and begins on February 14th. To mark the solemnity of this time, the church will be plain, without flowers and decorations.

The first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday and there will be two services to give parishioners the opportunity to contemplate Lent and begin the journey towards Easter. Ashes marking a cross sign are placed on our foreheads as a symbol of remorse. During Lent, many Christians spend time on Bible studies to guide their personal prayer and reflection. All are welcome to join the Lent Bible Study at St Alban's.

Traditionally the day before Lent begins is a time for feasting. All the luxury foods that won't be eaten during Lent are consumed. Given that those foods include eggs, milk and fat – ingredients for pancake batter – it is clear why it became traditional to make pancakes! In the UK, the day is known as Shrove Tuesday – the word 'shrove' is derived from 'shrive' meaning to forgive. At St Alban's we will be marking this with "Prayers and Pancakes".

For our alms giving and charitable deed, we will continue to focus on our Zimbabwe Appeal and find ways to give donations for the transportation costs of the donated goods that need to be sent to the school in Hera.

The fourth Sunday during Lent is Mothering Sunday. In England in the 16th century, it was an occasion to appreciate the motherly nature of the Church. More recently it has become a time to honour all mothers. The service at St Alban's on Mothering Sunday will include giving a posy of flowers to all the mums there.

The last week of Lent is Holy Week and begins with Palm Sunday, the day Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. It was a day of triumph when supporters waved palm branches and laid them on the ground, and to mark this, small palm crosses are distributed at church.

Holy Week, the last week of Lent, marks Jesus's last week before the crucifixion. Holy Wednesday, when Judas agreed to betray him; Maundy Thursday, when Jesus ate his last meal with his followers and was then arrested; and Good Friday, when Jesus was put on trial and executed. Lent ends with Easter Sunday – the day Christians celebrate Jesus rising from the dead.

The personal challenge for all Christians, is how to make Lent matter to us.

A busy Festive Season for the Parish Council saw the Christmas light switch on; a well attended Christmas Market; a fantastic Tractor Run and childrens' parties in the Barbour Institute, and the Parish Council also provided a post box for letters to Santa. Each child received a personal reply.

On 15th January, the Parish Council held its first meeting of 2024.

Members of the public raised concerns over blocked drains and the amount of flooding which had happened on all roads in to and out of the village, with specific emphasis on Rocky Lane and Frog Lane. The Parish Council was asked to support complaints to CWaC on these issues.

Ward Clir. Mike Jones told the meeting that Rocky Land and Chester Road had been made priorities and that work would be done imminently to resolve the flooding issues. Frog Lane was also on the priority list. There was representation from Inspired Villages in relation to a planning application which is awaiting determination by CWaC. The new Headteacher at Tattenhall Park Primary School came to the meeting with the Chair of Governors, to invite Councillors to an open afternoon at the school on 22nd January.

Cllr. Jones told the meeting that all outdoor facilities run by Edsential for CWaC would be reviewed including the Tattenhall Centre. There was concern that the facilities on offer did not meet modern requirements.

Agenda items:

- The Council would submit "No Objection" to the Gifford Lea planning application.
- An updated Housing Needs survey was noted.
- No progress was reported on the crossing on Church Bank.
- School Crossing: CWaC had done a count of vehicles and unaccompanied children crossing to the school and found that the numbers were too low for a crossing to be financed. The school would do its own research and parking enforcement was planned for the Spring Term. Children would dress as mini policemen to drive the

message home to parents.

- A report had been produced by Cllr. Carden on public transport for Tattenhall and the surrounding area. This would be submitted to CWaC.
- The Kissing Gate project had been on hold due to the excessively wet fields but would move forward as soon as possible. A new Public Rights of Way officer had been appointed by CWaC who was being very helpful and might be able to provide some funding.
- A King's Walk had been proposed as part of the Coronation project. The route chosen might have to be changed and Cllrs. would look at options.
- A further Coronation project was a mosaic which would be sited on the wall on the High Street near the Parish Council noticeboard. Children at the school had been involved in this and the project was well underway.
- There was a proposal to do some improvement work to the Youth Shelter and install benches on the site. Free wood had been offered to do the work and it was agreed that this should proceed but that the young people should be consulted first.
- A Memorial Bench was proposed for the Flacca replacing a bench by the Fetch statue.
- The Parish Council has now opened its Grant Application process to community groups and societies. An amount of £500 per application can be awarded but it must be noted that only one application per group can be considered.

The next meeting of the Council will be on 4th March at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute. Cllr Pat Black
