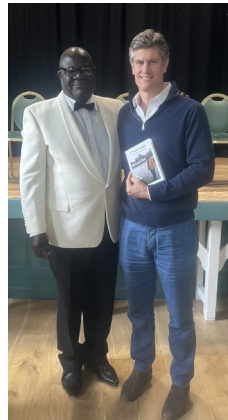


My Book Launch (The Cross Roads)

JANE'S JOTTINGS

I have been thinking about the art of wrapping! Probably because over the last few weeks I have had a lot of Birthday gifts to wrap. I like to give a gift which is wrapped nicely and neatly but I seldom do. Gift wrap in my opinion can be either perfection or a lump covered in paper! Sadly my wrapped gifts tend to fall in the lump category!

My daughter-in-law was born in Japan and lived there until she was 16. Her wrapping is perfect. The paper is taut and covers the gift precisely not a ripple or crease to be found. The two ends you fold and tape to secure the paper are perfectly flat with no bulge. I asked her the other day if it was a skill of hers or whether the Japanese in general had the gift. She said it was probably something to do with being taught origami at an early age.

I think the Americans are pretty good at it too. I think space helps. If you go to the gift wrap counter in stores that have this facility you will notice they have a lot of space to work with and everything is handy - scissors, tape dispensers and ribbon etc. There is a large roll of paper in a sort of dispenser on the wall where one can pull out a piece of paper and keep pulling until the exact size one wants is achieved. It is also straight edged and square if you follow me. I have noticed, however, if anyone in an American movie or TV programme is given a gift, it is usually in a gift box stuffed with masses of tissue paper finished off with a spectacular bow. I could probably do that! It may 'not take as much effort doing it that way but I must say I get somewhat agitated

when the recipient of the gift just opens the box, paws at the tissue, grabs the gift and casts the box aside! A decided lack of appreciation in my view!

When I start wrapping, I am full of good intentions. I gather all I am going to wrap, clear the table and fetch everything I am going to need. I usually discover that the pile of offcuts I have saved from previous 'wrap ins' still won't fit any of my assembled gifts! Having taken a rough estimate of the size of the gift I will start cutting. Even if the paper is the sort that you can run the scissors through without actually cutting it I never get it straight. In the middle of this the roll usually rolls off the table. The piece I have cut is often too small and that goes on the increasing pile of offcuts. I will cut another piece which will probably be too big but rather than reduce it I will plough on resulting in the two ends on my parcel being thick and bulky! I think my daughter-in-law, uses tape but it's invisible whereas my parcels are covered in it! If anything sticks out or looks in danger of splitting open, I just stick another piece of tape on it.

Then there is the aftermath. By the time I have wrapped everything there is the biggest mess. The table top would have disappeared covered with discarded off cuts, labels, ribbons, bits of tape, pens, bows and pairs of scissors because I can never find the original pair or the pairs that follow amongst the detritus that gathers! Perhaps I should follow the way of Movie Directors and use boxes!

Tattenhall & District Parish Council Chairman's Report 2024-2025

The past year has been yet another busy year for the Parish Council, seeing many projects coming to near completion, and others in their infancy. The kissing gates upgrade is now almost complete. This project has been ongoing for a couple of years now and will make many of the footpaths around the village more accessible for all.

The Parish Council has also installed two new benches, one in the Orchard, and one on the Flacca, dedicated to PCSO Hurst. The PC has worked with Cheshire West & Chester Council to replace the Gatesheath bus shelter, which needed an upgrade.

The Parish Council strives to work with all sections of society, and throughout the year we have been in discussions with the school to find a solution to deliver a MUGA for the village, something that would enhance the facilities at the school and for the village as a whole. This is still on going, and we are trying to overcome various obstacles.

The neighborhood plan update is soon to be completed and is just ending its formal Regulation 14 consultation period. This will then be sent for examination and be adopted.

The floods of the last few winters have not been forgotten... earlier in January the PC hosted an open meeting between the Village residents, EA, Highways and CWaC. After informative discussions, the conclusion was for the PC to form a working group to keep pressure on the local authorities and stakeholders to find solutions to the ongoing problems.

The centrally located emergency sandbag store at the school has been a relief to many after periods of heavy rainfall have caused water to rise. We will continue to maintain this facility and keep it well stocked.

As a statutory consultee in the planning process, the PC will always try and defend the best interests of the village. We know that we will be facing pressure from many developers to build on land around the village, and we will continue to consult with the village on the larger scale proposals.

The Christmas market and tractor event last December was bigger and better than the previous year and was a wonderful sight, enjoyed by crowds lining the streets! We hope to continue this into the future.

We look forward to another productive year.

Tattenhall Repair Cafe



What is a Repair Café? – A

Repair Café is a place where you can bring broken or defective household appliances, machines, clothing, ornaments, pictures or tools

for fixing by volunteers. A bit like the Repair Shop on TV but without the tears.



What sort of things can I bring? – The

sort of thing that you would otherwise throw away, that does not really justify a paid-for-repair. Try us with anything that is portable, that you can bring along. We cannot look at petrol fuelled appliances, or white goods, we are no good at computers. But we are very good at mechanical fixes. Take a look at the word cloud of the sorts of things we have fixed

Do you sharpen tools? Yes, we can sharpen kitchen knives, garden shears, secateurs, loppers. But not chainsaws.

Is it new? We have been running this in Tattenhall since July 2022 and have fixed 299 items

Is it safe? We PAT test all electrical goods before any electrical repair and afterwards

Is it free? There is no fee, it is free. We gratefully receive any donations as there are costs we have to cover like room hire. We are all volunteers though.

Is it guaranteed? There is no guarantee, we try our best. At the moment our success rate is 70%

Why? To save you the cost of having to replace something. To save sending stuff to landfill. To save the CO₂ involved in having a new replacement thing. We reckon we have saved Tattenhall over £14,000 in replacement costs, and over 7000kg of CO₂
