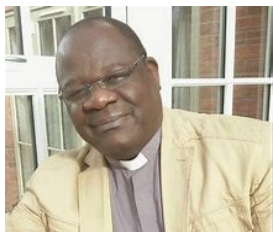

Greetings from the Rector

An Easter Message: From Despair to Hope

Alleluia! Christ Is Risen!

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

On Good Friday, fear ruled the hearts of the disciples. Their Teacher was crucified. Their hope seemed buried behind a sealed stone. But on Easter morning, fear gave way to astonishment and astonishment became faith. The women who went to the tomb came expecting death. Instead, they encountered life. They came carrying spices for a body. They left carrying the greatest news the world would ever hear.

Is this not how God often works? We often feel weighed down by grief, disappointment, regret and He meets us with resurrection power. The empty tomb is not just an event to remember; it is a promise to live by. Whatever stone seems sealed in your life despair, doubt or loss, God can roll it away. As the apostle writes in First Epistle to the Corinthians 15:55: *"O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?"*

Death is humanity's oldest enemy. It casts a shadow over every life. But on Easter morning, death met its conqueror. The resurrection is not symbolic optimism; it is divine intervention. It is God stepping into the darkest reality and declaring, "This will not have the final word." The suffering was real. The silence of Saturday was real. But so is resurrection. The resurrection tells every weary believer that God is still at work, even when the stone seems immovable, even when prayers feel unanswered, even when Friday's grief lingers. Sunday is coming. Easter invites us to believe and trust in the Lord. It invites us to trust. It invites us to surrender to the risen Savior. And because He lives, we can face tomorrow.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

JANE'S JOTTINGS

I have had a plaque in a spare drawer for ages which has "Remember to always be kind" written on it. It is destined for my youngest granddaughter. I keep forgetting about it but one of these days I will get it to her. In the meantime I keep coming across it and every time I do I have an issue with the wording, well one word, which is "remember". Isn't kindness innate and a spontaneous act? If so I would say one doesn't have to remember! Of course there are lots of kind gestures that are given a lot of thought but I'm talking about the spontaneous displays of kindness.

This meeting will take place on **Sunday 19th April** soon after the 10.30am service and will be held in the Church. Although much of the business of the meetings is of a formal character, it is none the less important, and we urge all who worship at St Alban's Church to be present. The matters under review include the election of Church Wardens, Councillors, Sidesmen and reports.

Church Calendar

- **23rd April** The celebration of St George- The Martyr of England, c304.
- **14th May Ascension Day:** an important day in the church year. Holy Communion will be celebrated at 7.30pm.
- **May 24th Whitsunday,** often, in the revised calendars of the churches, reverting to its older, Jewish name, of Pentecost. This is also an important day in the calendar and one which, since the abandonment in this country of the Bank Holiday which was once attached to it, has lost its public prominence. All who worship at St Alban's are urged to worship on this day, if at all possible.
- **May 31st** The Sunday following Whitsunday is called Trinity Sunday. It is a late-comer to the church year, dating only from the middle ages, and it was introduced in order to complete the round of the church year- those feasts and fasts by which we recall the significance of the life of Jesus are, Trinity Sunday reminds us, celebrations of a life significant because it is so designated by God.

in particular to build a life beyond poverty.

One example they give us is Fridah Moraa a widow with teenage twins, a daughter and grandson who live in rented corrugated metal shelters in Niarobi, with no running water and shared toilet facilities. Friday sells vegetables in a local market which she buys from a wholesaler, involving a two hour round trip six days a week. Beacon of Hope - a Christian Aid partner - is helping people like Fridah to grow their own vegetables in small,

This year Christian Aid is focusing our attention on the work they are doing for women

unused city spaces by giving training sessions in farming and business skills. They also support them with tools, seeds and plots to get started. Fridah is now able to feed her family with what she grows as well as selling some at the market, giving her food security and an income to pay the rent, school fees and health care.

Envelopes will be delivered during Christian Aid week for donations to the work of Christian Aid. Alternative ways of making donations are printed on the envelopes. If you have some spare time and would like to help with delivering envelopes to a small area in Tattenhall please contact Carolyn on 07881827430. They do not require collecting.



Neighbourhood Plan Update

You have until **Monday 13th April 2026** to submit comments as part of the **Regulation 14 Consultation** on the draft Neighbourhood Plan (NP). Comments should be emailed to reg14@tattenhallpc.co.uk.

You can find a copy of the draft plan on our website at <https://tattenhallpc.co.uk/the-parish-council/the-neighbourhood-plan/>. You can also find information on changes made to the Plan and why these changes have been made.

It is really important that residents respond to this consultation and let us know your views as the Plan can only succeed with community support.

What you should know....

Cheshire West and Chester (CW&C) Local Plan is currently out of date and the authority does not have the required 5 year housing land supply as such the policies it contains have reduced strength to stop large planning applications.

CW&C are currently developing a new Local Plan, they have consulted on 3 possible options:

• **Option A**

Retain the Green Belt - Farndon, Malpas, Tarporley, Tattenhall 500 - 1,500 houses **each**

• **Option B**

Follow current Local Plan level and distribution of development - Farndon, Malpas, Tarporley, Tattenhall up to 500 houses **each**

• **Option C**

Sustainable transport corridors - Farndon, Malpas, Tarporley, Tattenhall up to 500 houses **each**

It is unlikely a new Local Plan will be in place until December 2027 at the earliest.

Currently, our NP does not meet the NPPF (National Planning Policy Framework) criteria in para 14, which states

a) the neighbourhood plan became part of the development plan five years or less before the date on which the decision is made; and

b) the neighbourhood plan contains policies and allocations to meet its identified housing requirement"

As such it is classed as out of date, and its policies cannot defend against planning applications.

To meet the above criteria and have a valid up to date Plan which becomes planning policy we need to allocate enough development sites to meet the number of houses allocated to Tattenhall by CW&C.

The draft or pre-submission NP allocates land for up to 600 houses; this will be reduced if CW&C allocates fewer houses before the Plan's submission for examination.

The Parish Council is aware that there is not a local need from within Tattenhall for up to 600 more homes and that this level of development will result in the infrastructure including roads struggling unless they are improved. However, CW&C will allocate houses to Tattenhall, and the revised Plan seeks to mitigate the issues increased development may cause.

Policy 7 of the draft or pre-submission Plan seeks to allocate land to accommodate up to 600 and includes approximately 50% of the land in scenario 2 of our previous consultation. Scenario 2 (preferred as the least bad option) was a single site for approximately 700 houses between Chester Road and Frog Lane.

The Parish Council believes that Policy 7 is the best way to ensure the benefits specified, link roads, play areas, GP surgery, graveyard footpaths, etc. are delivered.

You will get a chance to vote on the Neighbourhood Plan. Voting against the NP at referendum will not stop large numbers of additional housing coming forward; it may in fact prevent some applications from being refused. The Parish Council strongly urges support for the Plan at the referendum.

Doctors Surgery / Health Centre Update

Bolesworth Estate is currently in discussion with NHS Cheshire and Merseyside ICB concerning the conversion of the empty building in Barbour Square to a Health Centre. This is not dependent on, nor *vice versa*, the Neighbourhood Plan land allocation. However, if the Barbour Square development does not go through, then there is provision specified in Policy 7 Land Allocation Phase 1 for a GP Surgery.

What happens next

Following the Reg 14 consultation we will consider the responses received and make required changes and updates.

The Parish Council will then have to approve the Plan for submission to CW&C when it will then go for examination by an independent examiner.

The examiner will produce a report on the Plan which can suggest modifications and will confirm it needs to go to referendum.

When the Plan goes to referendum all electors in the Plan area get to vote on whether to accept the Plan; 50% of those voting need to vote for the Plan for it to be agreed.

CW&C will then confirm the Plan is part of their planning policy and is referred to as the 'made' Plan.
