Dear Residents

In the past, in the run up to Christmas there have been notable sightings of suspicious vehicles and their occupants especially in outlying areas. Special targets are usually diesel and heating oil storage tanks on farms and remote properties. Last month in outlying villages there have been a couple of Burglaries by opportunist thieves. Remember if you come across someone with a lame excuse for being there don't sit on the information, call 101 immediately with as much detail as possible.

It is likely that at Christmas you may find yourself with some presents that are replacement high value items, TV and sound equipment etc. You may want to security mark these as a number of items such as high value bikes have been stolen recently. Also you might want to discard the packaging on new items discretely, cold calling or passing opportunist thieves are made aware of what is available in your home by the new packaging left in view awaiting the waste collection.

If you have a feeling that something is untoward please do not sit on the information. Ring 101 and let the Police make the decision. If it warrants a Police officer attending especially in the rural areas they will not think it time wasted in dealing with your call. Even if it turns out to be a false alarm the Police will be grateful to you for taking the trouble to report it. The day you don't is usually the day that you should have. Every piece of information about an incident helps the Police to

concentrate their officers where they are most needed. If it helps them it ultimately helps you. Think about it what have you got to lose.

More resources means Police back in our areas and better response times so make that call on 101 when you feel something is suspicious.

FROM THE RECTOR

Unto Us A Child is Born

For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

So begins one of my favorite pieces of music at Christmas time. This passage from the book of the prophet Isaiah celebrating the coronation of King Hezekiah has long been seen in Christian tradition as a prefiguring of the birth of Christ.

But as I reflect on the "child is born" I cannot help but be reminded that there are some who are fond of saying that the child who is born to us, the son given to us, was "born to die." It is the kind of thing that can certainly put a damper on the celebrations of the birth of the baby Jesus.

I understand where that comes from, of course. It comes from a view of Jesus' salvation as having been accomplished by his atoning death. Jesus is the perfect sacrifice for our sins and like the sacred red heifer bred for sacrifice in the Temple, Jesus was born for this purpose. He was born to be the substitutionary sacrifice for our death penalty. Born to die. It is a very common view of Jesus' salvation, especially in the world we live, where we are fond of crime and punishment metaphors. But it is not the only theory of atonement out there. There have been many over the centuries. Those who saw Jesus' atonement as a kind of ransom, those who see his atonement in his resurrection and not in his death. There are also those who see salvation in the divine declarations of solidarity with us in life, in death, and in new life. I am inclined to lean on the last one and it is quite powerful especially at

Christmas. For the idea that the very Word of God should become flesh, should dwell with us, should come to us as a defenseless, utterly dependent, weak, and helpless child, is a staggering declaration of the Solidarity of God. It is a reminder that there is no aspect of our lives that is apart from God. In our weakness and in our strength, in our joys and sorrows, in our sufferings and our celebrations, in our living and our dying, there God is with us. That is the real power of the Christmas story. The humble babe lying in a manger represents for us God coming to us fully. Not distant and removed. Not impassable and unreachable. But He is constantly there with us. That is cause for singing greater than the celebration of the birth of a sacrifice. It is the

cause for real joy. We are not alone.

Merry Christmas!

God is with us. Immanuel.

At the November meeting during Open Forum, Matthew Morris, of Bolesworth Estates informed the Parish Council about ticket sales during the initial launch of CarFest North 2016.

Residents with a CH3 9 postcode had been able to register for tickets in advance of the public sale and would have a further opportunity in Spring 2016 to buy. Watch out for further details on local media, posters, etc.

During the main meeting Councillor Pritchard announced that the Christmas Market would not take place on Friday 11th December on Barbour Square as in previous years. Fewer stallholders had booked spaces. A children's Christmas Party in the Barbour Institute was proposed on the same date, with a visit from Father Christmas. Further details are now available on the back page of the magazine.

Cllr. Weaver brought Councillors up to date on the reopening of the Planning Inquiry at Winsford. Cllr. Haynes undertook to raise with CWaC the fact that the Inquiry would not be webcast. As this was a matter of great public interest, he hoped to persuade the Borough Council to reverse that decision.

Discussions on the new play on the Park were going well. Three contractors had been contacted to provide quotes and once all had been received the Parish Council would be able to make a decision on the design of the playground. It is hoped to have a public consultation before a final decision is taken. Enforcement issues: The Parish Council had been informed that the garden wall at Gatesheath Hall Cottages will be removed 'within two months'. The Parish Council will monitor the situation.

Residents are welcome to raise any items of concern, during Open Forum at the commencement of meetings which are held on the first Monday of each month, upstairs in the Billiard Room of the Barbour Institute, commencing at 7.30 pm.

I hope you have a wonderful Christmas and a Happy, Healthy and Peaceful 2016.





HOMEWATCH

Dear Residents

In the past, in the run up to Christmas there have been notable sightings of suspicious vehicles and their occupants especially in outlying areas. Special targets are usually diesel and heating oil storage tanks on farms and remote properties. Last month in outlying villages there have been a couple of Burglaries by opportunist thieves. Remember if you come across someone with a lame excuse for being there don't sit on the information, call 101 immediately with as much detail as possible.

It is likely that at Christmas you may find yourself with some presents that are replacement high value items, TV and sound equipment etc. You may want to security mark these as a number of items such as high value bikes have been stolen recently. Also you might want to discard the packaging on new items discretely, cold calling or passing opportunist thieves are made aware of what is available in your home by the new packaging left in view awaiting the waste collection.

If you have a feeling that something is untoward please do not sit on the information. Ring 101 and let the Police make the decision. If it warrants a Police officer attending especially in the rural areas they will not think it time wasted in dealing with your call. Even if it turns out to be a false alarm the Police will be grateful to you for taking the trouble to report it. The day you don't is usually the day that you should have. Every piece of information about an incident helps the Police to

concentrate their officers where they are most needed. If it helps them it ultimately helps you. Think about it what have you got to lose.

If you aren't sure, you can always call HomeWatch for advice, or call CRIMESTOPPERS anonymously, on 0800 555 111

More resources means Police back in our areas and better response times so make that call on 101 when you feel something is suspicious.

- Your local council won't ever phone out-of-the-blue to discuss a council tax rebate. If you receive a call of this nature, put the phone down straight away.
- No legitimate organisation will ask you to pay an advanced fee in order to receive money, so never give them your card details.
 If you think you have been a victim of fraud, hang up the phone and wait five minutes to clear the line as fraudsters sometimes keep the line open. Then call your bank or card issuer to report the fraud. Where it is possible use a different phone line to make the phone call.

Some leaflets on potential scams are available at the Drop In (see below for details) Attempts at fraud via Telephone or e-mail are one of the increasingly growing ways of relieving you of your money. 


