FROM THE RECTOR

Remembrance Sunday in Tattenhall Church-12th November 2017

Remembrance Day honors the heroic efforts, achievements and sacrifices that were made in past wars. The main observance is on the second Sunday in November, but 2 minutes of silence is also made on November 11. People stop work to observe a moment of silence at 11am on November 11, which is the time and date when hostilities formally ended after more than four years of battle during World War I. Poppies are worn as a symbol of respect and tribute on Remembrance Sunday and/or November 11. The day is also marked by events such as memorial services, church services and parades. Remembrance Day is an observance and not a public holiday in the UK. Many businesses may temporarily pause activity at 11am for 2 minutes of silence.

In the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland **Remembrance Sunday** is a day "to commemorate the contribution of British and Commonwealth military and civilian servicemen and women in the two World Wars and later conflicts. It is held on the second Sunday in November, the Sunday nearest to 11 November, Armistice Day, the

anniversary of the end of hostilities in the First World War at 11 a.m. in 1918. Across The United Kingdom, Remembrance Sunday is marked by ceremonies at local war memorials in most cities, towns and villages, attended by civic dignitaries, exservicemen and -women (many are members of the Royal British Legion and other veterans' organizations), members of local armed forces regular and reserve units (Royal Navy and Royal Naval Reserve, Royal Marines and Royal Marines Reserve, Army and Territorial Army, Royal Air Force and Royal Auxiliary Air Force), military cadet forces (Sea Cadet Corps, Army Cadet Force and Air Training Corps as well as the Combined Cadet Force) and youth organizations (e.g. Scouts, Boys' Brigade, Girls' Brigade and Guides). Wreaths of remembrance poppies are laid on the memorials and two minutes' silence is held at 11 a.m.

In Tattenhall Community, we will have the Remembrance Service at St Alban's Church at 10.00am. At 11.00am, we will be at the cenotaph by the Barbour Institute where all the respective organizations will lay their wreaths.



The Parish Council held its monthly meeting on 2nd October in the Barbour Institute.

Before the official Agenda business began residents were invited to raise any issues about which they had concerns.

Some items, such as the matter of the proposed school fence and the speed of traffic on Tattenhall Road, had been raised at previous meetings and were being progressed.

Some concern was expressed about the building work at the Meadow Brook site and also about the state of the grass verge on Park Avenue.

One resident requested an additional dog fouling bin on Tattenhall Road and the Clerk would look into this.

Items from the Agenda:

- The Clerk reported that the annual Audit Return had raised no issues of concern;
- The planning application in respect of Low Ridge on Burwardsley Road would be considered at the Planning Meeting on 16th October;
- Cllr. Weaver had met with officers from CWaC Highways Department. She had been asked to keep the discussion confidential and would report back under Part 2 of the Agenda when the public and press are asked to leave the room;

- The new play area on the Park had been officially opened. The afternoon had been very successful, with even the weather being kind. Many people came to picnic, enjoy the live music and play on the new equipment. Some snagging issues had been raised and would be dealt with by the contractor;
- Cllr. Chapman reported that the Board of the Community Land Trust was in the process of applying for grants to cover the cost of professional fees;
- The Community Pride group had organised a Lantern Parade to be held on 1st December and a Christmas Market on 15th December. Details would be available later (and can be found elsewhere in the magazine);
- A quotation is being obtained for fencing on Glebe Meadow. There is some Open Space funding left from the play area work and the Clerk would find out if this could be used for Glebe Meadow.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 6th November at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute. All residents are welcome to attend.



BROWN KNOWL METHODIST CHAPEL Farewell to Rev. Marian Jones and Welcome to the Rev. Rob Weir

The year was 1822 when John Wedgwood became an itinerant preacher. The large oak tree in Brown Knowl was a venue for villagers to listen to him preach, beginning to worship and care for each other through Bible study and pastoral groups. A cottage on Sandy Lane was the first meeting place and eventually a new, larger chapel was built on the hillside at the turn of the century. The chapel was enlarged again with local people helping with the building. Electricity brought further changes when a new kitchen was installed along with an electric pipe organ and a war memorial stone.

Wilfred Owen, later reknowned for his war poems, wrote his first verse when on holiday with his uncle in Brown

Knowl. He lost his life in France in 1918, aged 25.

Methodism was born in song. The first Primitive Methodist hymnal at Brown Knowl is dated 1889.

Brown Knowl continues on into the future with a new Minister to lead us. The ladies meet each month; there is a men's supper club and walking group; Junior Church; and monthly Bible study groups. Coffee mornings and afternoon teas help to raise money for modernisation.

Brown Knowl is renowned for its hospitality— come and join us and share in our worship.

First and foremost this month we ask that you keep an eye on our War Memorial plagues as Bunbury had theirs stolen last month. If any suspicious activity is seen at all around the monument please tell the Police immediately and also contact HomeWatch on 01829 771641 A number of variations on scams attempting to access bank accounts have been reported recently; these are both by phone and by e-mail. The scams vary from bogus calls from Customs & Excise regarding fake legal proceedings, HMRC refunds, banks informing you of changes to online banking account procedures, Invoices for unsolicited items; all fake. In all cases report scams to http://www.actionfraud.police.uk/ report fraud Or call Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040. These attempts are changing all the time so please be wary of any unsolicited approaches. Now that the clocks have gone back, please remember to set a timer for lights and, or, radio to come on early evening to give the impression of the house being occupied. A house in darkness at this time of year is known to invite opportunist thieves. A number of unsolicited callers, allegedly scrap dealers, have called at both populated area and those with remote properties. The "dealers" are specifically interested in the contents of opened garages and have been found wandering around unattended farm yards. With the stolen war memorial plaques in mind, please record all information such as van registration and occupants' description should they call on you.
