

Merry Christmas to you all and a Happy New Year.




ew Advent Window will be revealed around the High Street every day through December,

During the Advent season, we will be studying the above book written by Bishop Gregory Cameron. An Advent Book of Days tells the stories of all the characters and creatures that make up the Christmas story, with daily prayers and reflections based on their experiences. Fully illustrated in colour, this rich seasonal companion combines the bible, history, art and legend to explore the story of the incarnation. For each day of Advent, we meet a character caught up in the drama of the nativity, from the archangel Gabriel to the ox and ass in the stable. We discover what their portrayal in scripture reveals about them, how they have been understood in history, what folk legends have accrued around them, and what their stories offer for faith and devotion today. This is a book to engage all the senses and the imagination, to be enjoyed slowly and to shed new light on the most famous and familiar story of all.



"TRICK OR TREAT"" - what was that all about?

Basically, it's an Americanisation of the traditional All Souls night, where the children of the parish would sing at eacj homestead in exchange for a treat from the lady of lhe house on the eve of "All Hallows" or "All Souls" day when all the souls of dearly departed friends and family would be hallowed (revered) - hence the name Halloween" corrupted from "Hallow evening".

The song I used to sing in my childhood days was

"Souler, Souler, souler cake
Please, good Missus, a souler cake,
Apple or pear, plum or cherry —
Any good thing to make us merry.
If you've not got a penny a ha'penny will do.
If you haven't a ha'penny then God bless you."

A soul cake, also known as a soulmass-cake, is a small round cake with sweet spices, which resembles a shortbread biscuit.

The song had variations throughout the county although there were verses too, we sang just the chorus (less time at each house!) Fancy dress was optional, but most made an effort with old bed-sheets for ghostly attire or some of Mum's make-up for a ghoulish look.
