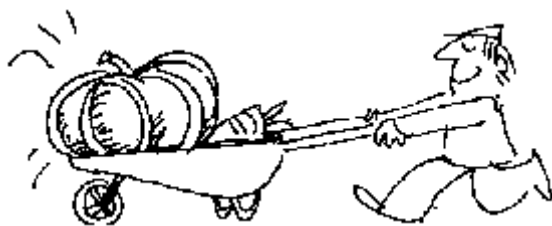

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

For this year only, to avoid the handling of money, there will be no class entry fees and no prize monies.

First, second and third cards and cups and trophies will be awarded as usual.

1. All Classes are open.
2. Exhibits in sections A, B, C and D must have been grown by the exhibitor or have been cultivated by the exhibitor for at least the three months prior to the show. Uniformity and the same variety of specimens score higher in judging.
3. Wherever possible, exhibitors are encouraged to display the name of the variety of fruit, vegetable, flower or plant being exhibited.
4. Entries in sections E, F, G, H, I and J are to be the exhibitor's own work.
5. If there are three or fewer entries in any class, the judges reserve the right to combine classes.
6. In all classes, if exhibits are considered not up to standard, the granting of an award will be left to the judge's discretion. At the judge's discretion a prize will be presented to the best exhibit in each section.
7. In **ALL** cases the judge's decision will be **FINAL**.
8. Trophies and cups are to be held for one year and must not be engraved.
9. Entry forms will be accepted between 9.00am and 11.30am on the day of the show at the Barbour Institute.
10. All exhibits to be staged between 9.00am and 12 noon. At 12 noon the hall will be cleared for judging.
11. Trophies will be presented at 4.00pm.
12. No exhibits may be removed before the presentation of trophies.
13. Exhibitors must provide their own vases, dishes etc.
14. All exhibits are entered at the exhibitor's own risk.

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

BARBOUR CLEGG CUP - To exhibitor with highest number of points in show

BROSTER CUP - To exhibitor with second highest number of points in show

SECTION A - FLOWERS

FLOWER TROPHY - Best entry in section A

- 1 Vase of three roses
- 2 One specimen rose – please display rose name on a card
- 3 One multi-headed or multi-stemmed rose
- 4 One Geranium (Pelargonium) head
- 5 One Hydrangea head
- 6 Vase of five Dahlias
- 7 Three ornamental grass seed heads (one variety)
- 8 One Seed head
- 9 Vase of mixed garden flowers (may include annuals, perennials or shrubs)
- 10 Vase of annuals, one variety
- 11 Vase of mixed foliage or berries
- 12 Three stems of any plant / shrub in flower - one variety not already included in the schedule
- 13 Six Fuchsia flowers (containers will be provided)
- 14 Vase of Sweet Peas
- 15 Three Hosta leaves (one variety)
- 16 Five stems of foliage
- 17 Five dried flower heads (any varieties, mixed or same)

SECTION B – VEGETABLES

BROCKLESBY SALVER - Best entry in section B

- 18 Five tomatoes, not cherry tomatoes
- 19 Five cherry tomatoes of any colour
- 20 Five pods of podding (ordinary) peas
- 21 Five mangetout or sugar snap pea pods
- 22 Five runner beans
- 23 Five French beans
- 24 Five potatoes - named
- 25 One lettuce – any variety
- 26 Three root vegetables of one variety excluding radishes (tops may be removed)
- 27 Bunch of five herbs suitable for use in cooking (in water)
- 28 Five radishes (tops removed)
- 29 Three courgettes
- 30 Five stems of chard with leaves
- 31 One cucumber
- 32 Collection of three different salad items
- 33 Any other variety of vegetable not already in the schedule
- 34 Five specimen vegetables (one each of five different varieties)

SECTION C - FRUIT

FRUIT BOWL TROPHY – Best entry in section C

- 35 Three strigs of redcurrants
- 36 Three strigs of blackcurrants
- 37 Five gooseberries, culinary or dessert
- 38 Five strawberries
- 39 Five raspberries
- 40 Any other fruit not already in the schedule (including ornamental fruits)

SECTION D - POT PLANTS & MISCELLANEOUS

POT PLANT TROPHY - Best entry in section D

- 41 Any Bonsai up to 12" (30 cm) wide
- 42 Any pot plant in bloom
- 43 Foliage plant
- 44 One specimen Cactus or succulent
- 45 A Fuchsia
- 46 Any exotic flower or flowering plant
- 47 Orchid in a pot
- 48 An amusing / peculiar flower, vegetable or fruit
- 49 A jam jar of weeds

SECTION E - COOKERY

COOKERY PLATE TROPHY – Best entry in section E

Guidance Notes for the Cookery Section

- 1. Use new lids for jams and all preserves.
 - 2. Jars need to be full to the top of mixture to create the seal when the lid is applied.
 - 3. Wax discs are not needed with metal lids.
 - 4. Make sure that there are no air pockets in the jar as the contents will go mouldy more quickly. Remove with a cocktail stick.
 - 5. Careful thought given to presentation always gains marks.
 - 6. Taste is everything so don't forget to season where required.
 - 7. All preserves should show date made.

- 50 Jar of jam
 - 51 Jar of chutney (at least 3 months old)
 - 52 Jar of jelly
 - 53 Butter shortbread
 - 54 Individual enclosed savoury pie or pasty
 - 55 Vegetable cake (made with any vegetable/s)
 - 56 Victoria sandwich (filled with raspberry jam and dusted with caster sugar)
 - 57 Five bread rolls

SECTION F - FLOWER ARRANGING

FLORAL TROPHY - Best entry in section F

Flowers do not have to be home grown

- 58 “Little Gem” – a petite arrangement in an egg cup not to exceed 9” (23 cm) in width or height
- 59 “Freedom” arrangement not to exceed 24” (60 cm) in width
- 60 Flowers arranged in a jug or vase

To be judged by public vote during the afternoon

A humorous arrangement to depict a television programme.

Please display the programme name on a card.

Arrangements not to exceed 24” (60 cm) in width.

This is a fun entry with no technical rules – everyone is welcome to have a go.

It is not part of the classes that are judged – the winner is decided by public vote.

SECTION G – CRAFTS

CRAFT PLATE TROPHY - Best entry in section G

- 61 A piece of hand needlecraft (e.g. embroidery, patchwork, cross-stitch, tapestry, quilting)
- 62 A hand knitted or crocheted item
- 63 A piece of jewellery or bead craft
- 64 A hand made greetings card (not from a kit)
- 65 A craft of your own choice not already in the schedule
- 66 An upcycled item

SECTION H – PHOTOGRAPHY

MILLENNIUM CUP - Best entry in section H

Signatures / identification on exhibits must be covered over

Exhibits must not have been entered in a previous Tattenhall Gardening Society Show and must be the exhibitor's original work.

All entries - print size to be no more than 12" x 10".

IMPORTANT - All entries to be stuck on card.

- Please write your name and the class number (e.g. 69 for a Buildings entry) on the **rear** of the card.

- 69 Buildings

ART TROPHY – Best entry in section I

Exhibits must be an original artwork and must not have been entered in a previous Tattenhall Gardening Society Show. Signatures on exhibits must be covered over.
